



Xtreme Reading "Preparation/Think Sheet"

Identify Eligible Students	 Review your students' reading data and/or assess students for reading levels. Verify the number of students that fall below the cut point (performing two or more years below grade level, but reading at least on a 4th grade level). Establish how many sections of Xtreme Reading will be needed to meet the needs of identified students. (Xtreme: 15 students per section) Consider these questions: "Will we instruct in all grade levels or target specific grade levels?" (e.g., 8th grade and freshmen only) "Will we mix grade levels in Xtreme classrooms or schedule students by grade?" Order Materials and Organize Space	 Through the Xtreme Reading professional developer, order the materials for the Xtreme Reading classes. Shipment can take up to 3 weeks. Order classroom sets of novels for the guided reading component of the program. (Novels are recommended in the program, but substitutions can be made.)
